Supervisors Report

Town-

Correspondence-

- -Verizon Notice of claim from damage that was done on their lines. Crowningshield has been working with Verizon and they have verbally stated they will be dropping the claim.
- -IRS letter that was dated in March and just received and all items have been corrected that were in this letter.
- -SPEDS renewal permit septic system at Noblewood. This renewal on the septic system will be done by Patrick McCauliffe.
- -Even year election law was overturned in the Appellate Court.
- Fish and Wildlife letter to do a lampricide treatment of the Bouquet will be May 20th and this might be cancelled due to the river flows.
- -Masonry company will be coming in the fall to repair the front steps of the Town Hall.
- Dog kennel from Verizon Structures will be arriving around August 4th.
- -National Honor society has requested to reserve the pickleball courts for a tournament on June 21st.
- -MJ Engineering has given a production schedule for the Water Plant and they are scheduled to start in early 2026.

- -CAT Court where a judge could come in and handle arraignments. The Sheriff Department, public defenders and the DA are in collaboration to make first appearance and arraignment go smoother and not have overnight stays. OCA will have to approve this.

There are three pieces of equipment that the town has from operating the golf course. Crowningshield acquired values of this equipment from dealerships. These pieces are valued at fairway mower-\$6,500.00, John Deere riding lawnmower -\$8,500.00 and the greens mower- \$20,000.00. The board discussed that giving any of these to the golf course is illegal from a municipality. They are the property of the town, even if donations were given toward the purchase of these items.

Benway made a motion to put the fairway mower and the riding lawnmower on a two week notice for a short bid and look for best value and if the bids are not acceptable they can list again or bring it back to the board for discussion. Sayward second the motion.

Gillilland amended the motion to declare both pieces excess and put them to bid. Benway seconded the motion.

A meeting was held with MJ Engineering on the water plant. They have the permit packages ready to go. Peter Paine changed the easement and the permit is for the septic to allow a bathroom at the plant. Also a permit application going to all the regulatory agencies including APA and the Corp of Engineers. These need to be signed and authorized by the supervisor to be submitted.

Benway made a motion for Supervisor Gillilland to sign the permit applications to be submitted for the new water treatment plant facility. Sheehan seconded the motion. Sheehan seconded the motion. All in favor.

New Business-

The public service commission has authorized the removal of the tariff for the Willsboro Bay Water Company and released the town from operation and maintenance of that system. The commission sent a letter that will need to go out to all residents on this system. In the letter it will have a note saying the water has been tested by the Department of Health. The system has been turned on and it is working. It will be the responsibility of users of the seasonal water system to maintain the system and also to test the water in accordance with the New York Department of Health regulations. All they need to do is to have an operator, this position does not require any permits or qualifications. This person will turn the system on in spring and off in the fall and fix leaks. The town charges \$250 to each customer using this season. It takes a lot of hours to maintain this system each year.

Benway made a motion to acknowledge the public service commission's decision and authorize sending out the proper notification that was written by the Public Service Commission. Sheehan seconded the motion. All in favor.

The roofs of the Visitors Center, Noblewood, Band Stand and the Cupola on the Town hall all need to be replaced. This would need to go out to bid with a 30 year protection material or alternate of metal and have each project be a separate bid. Gillilland said he will clear it through codes to see if metal can be put on a public building.

Benway made the motion to put out to bid the roofs of the Visitors Center, Noblewood, Bandstand and the Cupola on the Townhall. These bids will all be separate and with a 30 year protection material and alternate metal. Sheehan seconded the motion. All in favor.

The Yamaha golf carts lease agreement has two more years left and Gillilland reached out to Diddle LLC to see if they would want to take over the lease agreement and they responded that they were not interested in more than one year. Gillilland sent a copy of the lease to the lawyer and they drafted a letter to Yamaha to get out of the lease because we are not operating any longer.

Sheehan made the motion for Gillilland to send the letter to Yamaha that the attorney drafted. Sayward seconded the motion. All in favor.

There was a situation at the Visitors Center recently and several over the last few years. The cameras that are there no longer work and Gillilland said there is a need to have cameras both inside and outside. Estimated cost is \$500.

Sheehan made the motion to install cameras in the visitors center inside to cover the office and food locker and also outside that cover the parking lot. Benway seconded it.
